CPLP and Membership Privileges!

Earning your Certified Professional in Learning and Performance (CPLP) credential requires passing a 150-item knowledge exam and successfully completing a work product in one of five areas of expertise from the ASTD Competency Model. This is a challenging, but worthwhile, endeavor that typically requires six months or more of your time. Not only is there a significant time investment, the study materials needed for the knowledge exam and fee to enroll as a CPLP candidate can cost more than \$1,200.

Fortunately, one of the benefits of being a member of ASTD Nebraska is that you have access to study materials and the option to participate in a study group at no cost.

In addition, you can apply for up to \$400 to help pay for your CPLP candidate enrollment through the Julie Durmaskin Professional Education Scholarship.

The CPLP is a great way to demonstrate your expertise in the field of workplace learning and performance. ASTD Nebraska is here to make it easier for you to earn this credential.

The Power of 2: An Interview with Wendy Leedy, ASTD National Chapter Relations Manager Western Area

What is your role with the National ASTD Chapter/Organization?

I work as an employee of the National ASTD Office as support for resources and as a liaison to chapter leaders west of the Mississippi.

How long have you been a member of ASTD and what other roles have you had within the organization?



I am a relatively new member of just over 1 year. Prior to my current role, I worked in the Chapter Services Division.

For those that are new members to ASTD, what exactly is the Power of 2?

The Power of 2 allows members to take advantage of important opportunities in your local chapters and power up to opportunities at a national level, with resources and networking of over 40,000 members.

You also receive the monthly magazine publication known as *T&D*, eNews letters, access to webcast training seminars, book summaries, and periodicals via the on-line library. In addition, you are offered discounts for CPLP Certification, ASTD conferences, and career opportunities.

How can the Power of 2 enhance an ASTD member's professional development?

One of the great things that ASTD Power of 2 can provide is relevance of its offerings to members based on their location. At ASTD National we recognize that individuals, chapters, and communities are different across the world. Power of 2 members can take advantage of webcasts or course offerings that can be tailored to fit those specific needs.

What is the best way for a local chapter member to enroll and become a National ASTD member in order to have the Power of 2?

It is recommended that a member interested in obtaining the Power of 2 Membership go to the <u>ASTD Store</u>. In order to receive your discount, you will enter your chapter's ChIP code to receive the discounted rate.

It is important to use your local code. Each new membership yields \$20 in ChIP revenue for your chapter. The ASTD Nebraska Chapter ChIP code is CH6004. Anytime you purchase or enter the ChIP code for your chapter, they receive revenue to the local organization.

What advice do you have to offer those that are new to the Professional Coaching and Training Industry?

Get involved with professional organizations relevant to your organization's industry. In addition, get involved and network as much as possible through your local ASTD Chapter. Attend local meetings and volunteer. When you are ready and there are open availabilities, consider being a member of your ASTD Board of Directors. Those activities will allow you to broaden your professional network.

In your career what is the greatest benefit you have received from being a Power of 2 Member?

I have the best opportunities in my position to work with over 40,000 members and 125 local chapters.
