watching the winners advance to their spot in the pools, courts, tracks, and gymnasiums of London. To me, the talents of those athletes seem a bit supernatural. I would never put myself in a class of Olympiads. But, I do understand a couple of traits those athletes have to pursue their chances of taking home the gold. When I am at spinning class or riding my bike with others, I like to "think" I am winning. Even if I am competing against myself...I enjoy the competitive feeling I get when I am pushing my previous time or see I may be yards ahead or behind other riders.

However, there is one skill that Olympic athletes and adult learning professionals have in common...being in the ZONE!

I recently read an article by Shane Murphy, PhD, a licensed psychologist and associate professor of psychology at Western Connecticut State University. Dr. Murphy has been involved in Olympic athletes' psychology in one fashion or another since 1987. Murphy says: "What's fascinating is that we find that athletes often don't need to be perfect to succeed. Being in the 'zone' isn't about perfection as much as it is about staying in the moment, not worrying about failure, and not worrying about what the result might be. Once they're ready, they focus and let it happen."
